The University of Oklahoma prides itself on a prestigious and winning tradition. We must be dedicated to playing by the rules to ensure that feeling remains strong. As fans and supporters of Oklahoma, you are considered to be boosters of the University; therefore, it is essential that you understand and follow these rules and regulations to ensure that Oklahoma stays at the top of collegiate athletics.

Following are important NCAA rules for a booster to be aware of and fully understand (please note this is not an exhaustive list).

Per NCAA regulations a booster may not:

Be involved in on- or off-campus recruitment of a prospect (or the prospect's family). This includes face-to-face, telephonic or written communication (this includes interaction on social networking sites such as MySpace and Facebook). The NCAA generally considers someone to be a "prospect" once the individual enters 9th grade.

Provide a prospect (or the prospect's relatives, friends, coach, etc.) recruiting inducements. Inducements include, but are not limited to, financial aid, gifts, benefits and arrangements of any type.

Provide a student-athlete (or the prospect's relatives, friends, coach, etc.) with extra benefits. The term "extra benefit" refers to any special arrangements to provide the student-athlete (or his/her relative, friends, etc.) with a benefit (cash, meal, housing, etc.) based on any degree due to the individual's status as a student-athlete.
